

Assistant Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary/Assumption Parishioners,

I have always loved the outdoors and the many ways in which God formed so beautifully creation. Of all the features in a beautiful landscape, I am most interested in trees. Unlike mountains and rocks, trees are living and changing. And unlike the smaller understory vegetation, the larger species of trees have such a dynamic effect on the landscape.

The redwoods in northern California blow my mind! What is so remarkable about them is just how crazy tall they get. Of these giants one has made a name for itself, it is called Hyperion. Hyperion is the tallest known living tree in the world with a height of 380 ft. Looking at pictures of it, or any other large redwood, leaves me in awe asking, "how does something grow that tall?!"

But the reality is that it took time...a lot of time. It is estimated that Hyperion in 600-800 years old. As we enter into this season of Lent we might have the expectation and hope to become spiritual giants. The desire to have great growth in our spiritual life is certainly a good thing, but we must remember it might take time. It took Hyperion hundreds of years to become a mighty redwood. That means it might take us more than one season of Lent to get to where we want to be.

So, the question this Lent is not, "what is God calling me to become?" We know he is calling us to all be saints. The question we need to be asking and discerning this Lent is "how is God calling me to become more of the saint I am called to be?" This Lent is an opportunity for another season in our spiritual life to put on growth, just like Hyperion has been putting on growth little by little for hundreds of years.
