Dear St. Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

We can thank God for the moisture received this week of about an inch. The ice made for dangerous walking and driving, especially on the country roads. Our parking lot was a sheet of ice that I hope melts very soon

I look forward to welcoming back Frs. Schukei and Ventre. I am glad they could get away when school was out of session. I am still pinching myself to remind that I am no longer in schoolwork. It is very liberating.

John and Rosa Didier donated towards building the addition of the Didier Room in 1973. This space has served as our parish hall, meeting space, social center, classroom and multi purpose room for the past fifty years. We are grateful for their generosity and foresight of this addition to the school and gym. With the help of many volunteers, we got the Didier Room completely cleaned and repainted this past week. Greg Aschoff was my lead in painting, bringing expertise, all the right equipment, labor and QC. Ken and Judy Polacek prepped the room, cleaned it out and were there every day installing the new ceiling tiles, painting, fixing and cleaning. Helping paint were Dale Juranek, Deb Dinkelman, Michael Lachance and myself. The new chairs look good and were purchased by the funraising committee – many thanks! We will be putting some things up on the walls soon which should make it even more inviting and attractive. I thank each person who gave so generously of their time and talent to show some TLC to this main (only) meeting space for our parish (apart from the rectory). We may need to install some cabinets before long for storage, organization and serving food, drinks etc. I feel really good and happy about accomplishing this over the break. Thanks to those who moved their meetings. Onward and upward.

The big news of the week was the death last Saturday, December 31, of our Beloved Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. As Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger, he came to visit and give a lecture in our seminary in 1987 at St. Joseph's in Yonkers, NY. I received a signed copy of Journey to Easter, from a thoughtful seminarian. We studied his Introduction to Christianity in first Theology. I have since read many of his books including the The Meaning of Christian Brotherhood, God is Near us, Ratzinger Report, Light of the World, Pilgrim Fellowship of Faith, Salt of the Earth, Jesus of Nazareth (3 parts) and many encyclicals, apostolic exhortations, homilies, interviews. His writing style is brilliant, humble, wise, relevant and holy. Someone has suggested that he was the most cultured and intellectual mind in the world. There were enormous shoes to fill when St. John Paul II died in April of 2005. The Holy Spirit and college of cardinals knew what they were doing in voting for Cardinal Ratzinger, who was the prefect for the congregation for the doctrine of the faith for 23 years. Ten years ago today, he ordained my classmate Archbishop Charles Brown (a great man) who is now the Apostolic Nuncio in the Philippians. Cardinal Ratzinger was the main writer for the 1992 Catechism of the Catholic Church, a treasured teaching gift for the Church for many years to come. He lead the Church though the priests sex crises by instituting penalties, laicizing priests, changing the reporting and discipline policies, and making clear how sinful and horrendous are these crimes against the laity and

We owe him our continued prayers and admiration for the hard work and tremendous service he humbly gave to the Church. May he rest in peace. Thanks to all who came to the Mass for him this past Thursday. **May God bless you. FBC, Pastor**
