



Assistant Pastor's Corner

Dear St. Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

It looks like my reign as interim pastor has come to an end. Fr. Connor is back from his trip and the rectory is back to its usual capacity of three priests. So I suppose you could say that it is back to the simple and ordinary tasks of an assistant pastor. Sometimes the ordinary and relatively hidden aspects of our lives feel meaningless or that they have no effect on the world.

A while ago I watch a powerful movie entitled A Hidden Life. It is a film about an Austrian farmer named Franz who encounters many hardships because of his refusal to contribute in any way to Hitler's war efforts during WWII. It was a great reminder of what the virtuous life lived out looks like, but what hit me even more was the idea of the "hidden life." What this idea is pointing to is "how will we act when we think our actions will have no lasting effect?" In Franz's case, the fact that he made no significant effect in his community or the war is an example of what a good hidden life looks like. It is a life well lived by not compromising what is truly important, without any reward in doing so. Perhaps you have felt this way at times in your own life. Like Franz, we likely will not change the world with how we live out our hidden or ordinary days, but will we change? And if we do, will it be for better or for worse?

I challenge you to reflect on the things that are truly important to you. Then ask yourself, "how will I stay steadfast in keeping those things a priority in my life when life gets dull or feels uneventful?" Like Franz, may we too be steadfast in being faithful to what is important and what we are called to do, even in our "hidden life.
