**Rosary** prayed on Mon-Fri 12:05pm all thru May for the new Pope. **Pastors Corner:** Dear St Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

Happy Easter Octave and Divine Mercy Sunday. With the death of dear Pope Francis, we have extra cause for prayer, gratitude and reflection on his papacy. Personally, I loved what he wrote in his encyclicals and apostolic exhortations. I especially recommend his first one co-written with Pope Benedict "Lumen Fidei," the Light of Faith, and his last one "Dilexit Nos" on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. My two favorite Apostolic Exhortations were the Joy of the Gospel on Evangelization and Joy of Love on Marriage. (Cont'd next column)

While his death was not a surprise, I feel a loss for our Church of a holy, charismatic man. I have known the last three popes well over the last nearly 50 years and each one was a remarkable man in very different ways. I loved Pope John Paul II for his love of youth, sporty background and human touch at World Youth Day in Denver in 1993. That encounter instantly gave me a deep connection with the successor of Peter. I was enamored with Pope Benedict as a cultured, brilliant, prolific theologian. I admired Pope Francis for his love for the poor, poetic flair, Jesuit style, and folksy phrases. I loved all three of their writings, passions, and different personalities. God creates each human being unique and gifted. Now we pray (and fast) for the College of Cardinals as they meet in conclave and elect the next pope.

While many turn to Netflix and watch Conclave to anticipate what is coming, I will attempt to summarize some key features. The Pope's funeral is Saturday and nine days later begins the Conclave (latin: With key) on May 5. We are in the period of "interregnum" between the reigns of papacy when there is a "sede vacante", empty seat.

There are currently 252 Cardinals, all of them are invited to Rome but some are sick or unable to attend. They have begun General Congregations to discuss the needs of the church today. This is a time of prayer, discussion, discernment, and reflection and will continue thought the nine days after the funeral until the conclave begins. For the Conclave, 135 of the Cardinals are under 80 years old and eligible for voting as "electors". They will select 120 to enter the conclave, a highly secretive meeting in Sistine Chapel. At that time the current Camerlengo (one who takes over for the Pope), Cardinal Kevin Farrell will announce "Extra Omnes" or everyone out. They all take an oath of secrecy. During the Conclave, there are no electronics, or communication with the outside world. They are blocked from all media sources. The cardinals are confined to the Apostolic Palace the whole time until the election is complete.

They have as many as four secret ballots a day. Nine cardinals are assigned to make sure things are counted correctly: 3 to collect, 3 to count and 3 to verify. The new Pope needs 2/3 majority for election. The new Pope will be chosen based on his balance of doctrine, pastoral sensitivity and abilities to help the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church; as well as a combination of popularity and suitability. They can ask Cardinals questions. When John XXIII was asked about his weight he said, "It's not a beauty contest." They can elect a non- present Cardinal, Bishop, Priest (maybe Fr. Schukei) or layman. Pope Francis was elected in 2 days after 5 ballots, Pope Benedict on 2 days after 4 ballots and JPII after 3 days and 8 ballots.

After each vote, there is smoke released: black (ballots with wet straw) signifies nobody elected, white signifies we will soon hear from the Camerlengo "Annuntio vobis Gaudium magnum, Habemus Papam" I announce to you with great joy, we have a Pope, and his name is

The new Pope is vested in a white cassock in the "room of tears" because of the emotion he must feel and the magnitude of the call from God to succeed Peter. He can cry as long as needed before addressing the public with courage and faith. His life will never be same.

May God bless our Catholic Church and have mercy on us, FBC
