ASSISTANT PASTOR'S CORNER

What does it mean to live out our faith? With the start of a new year, we have a natural inclination to look at things in a new way, a different way, to start fresh somehow. The Church has understood this from the very beginning, which is why the turn of the year happens during the Christmas season. The celebration of that first encounter that we had with God, as He came to us in the Incarnation.

This encounter with Jesus is what changes lives. For several individuals in our parish, they are acting on what God has already done in their lives and are seeking to follow the way of Christ more closely than before - receiving the sacraments and devoting their energy seeing the world as God does. This step takes courage, especially in a time where believing in God and hoping in the future that He brings are seen by the world as a nuisance at best and dangerous at worst. But God has already conquered the world. Through the Cross and Resurrection, Jesus has torn apart the grasp that Sin and Death had on us, and now calls us to follow Him to true life.

The men and women who have been learning in OCIA (the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) and who are looking to receive the sacraments of Baptism and/or Confirmation, going to Confession and receiving our Lord in the Eucharist for the first time, are about to take their first public steps toward the Christian life that Jesus taught his Apostles to proclaim to the world.

Next weekend, these men and women will officially enter into the Catechumenate (for the non-Baptized) or the Candidacy (for the Baptized, but not Confirmed), which means that they have an explicit desire to enter into full communion with the Church and her head, Jesus Christ. As we get into the season of Lent, they will express that desire by allowing Jesus to examine their hearts in the three Scrutinies - which are meant to assist the Catechumens and Candidates spiritually through prayer and exorcism - breaking the hold of Satan and strengthening them for their new life of virtue.

If you are wondering what all of this has to do with you: These Catechumens need **support**. One of the ways that we can live out our faith as Christians is by praying for these people. Their names will be published in a future bulletin, but even now, praying for them generally, fasting for them, encouraging them as they take these important steps is of incredible importance. We all desire to walk with someone on this pilgrim journey, make sure that you are the one to walk with them - even if all you can do is pray! As if prayer is a "weak" thing - HA!

As this year begins, devote yourself growing closer to Christ. One way to do that is by giving time out of your day to pray for those who need it, and our Catechumens are in need of prayers. Be on the look out for ways to get involved in parish activities - including supporting our Catechumens! **Fr. Beardslee**
