

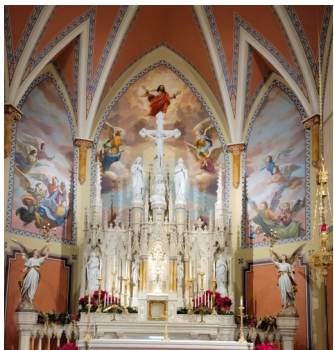

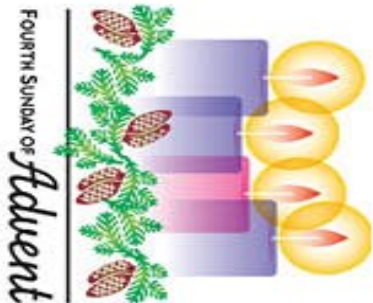

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear St. Mary’s Parishioners,

We celebrate the fourth week of Advent this weekend. We hear the Gospel announcing the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. I was excited to hear the choir rehearsing for Mid-night Christmas Mass on Tuesday night. They sounded beautiful and told me they were going to also have some brass and a violin. Remember, we have communal penance service this Sunday at 4 p.m. at St. Mary’s. We will have at least six priests, so come and make your Advent Confession. There are also additional times available this week. Also, we will be decorating the Church for Christmas on Thursday (22nd) after the 5:30 p.m. Mass. If we get a good number of volunteers, it will take less than an hour.

Msgr. Ivan Vap died at 94 year old this past week. He was ordained in 1959 (same as Msgr. Herbek). He had numerous assignments over his 63 years of priesthood. We took good notes and will try to get different people to organize the event next year so it is not always the same crew (spread the love).

We had our Parish Council meeting this past week and I reviewed the financial information with them. I wanted to inform you of some key financial information as we near the end of 2022.

Bottom line, at 5 ½ months into the budgeted year (as of Dec 13), we have a net income of \$921 (Just scraping by). We have paid \$10,000 per 4 months (\$40K) to the diocese so our loan from the Bishop is down to \$140,000. This was not budgeted, so I am glad we can manage this and it basically is reducing our cash balance that we had from last year (when we received two major gifts totaling \$183K). Our Endowment is at \$1,768,381 at the end of October and we received \$47,644 this fall as a semi annual distribution. Our Endowment principal (original investment) is \$1,653,343 so at end of October the value was about \$115,000 above principal. Our bank account has \$71,920 and Restoration (building) Account has \$92,787. St Mary’s savings at Diocesan Invest and Loan (DIAL) has \$10,940 and Building fund at DIAL has \$56,035. Between St. Mary’s cemetery accounts (3) they have \$104,204. The Fun raising has a \$32,363 balance. As you can see in the bulletin we are about two weeks behind in our budgeted Sunday collection. I sure hope we go into the positive side by calendar year end, because Christmas is a big time for giving. I firmly believe that God has blessed our parish with bountiful resources to operate financially. While we have big financial responsibilities (needs for parish), I believe in the saying that “the need of the giver to give is greater than that need of the receiver (Church) to receive.” The Catholic Church at St. Mary’s is a very important part of our community. We are blessed with hundreds of very generous families. I am grateful to each and everyone who are giving sacrificially to the work of God. May God continue to bless you as we prepare to celebrate the Birth of Christ our Savior.

Ways to give to the Church: There are lots of ways to give to St. Mary’s Church. The normal ways is via the Sunday collection, by envelop with a check or cash. You can give weekly, monthly, quarterly, or once a year. It is less work for our accounting to received monthly or even once a year, but we also need the cash flow (so don’t everyone give at end of year). Automatic withdrawal (ACH) is awesome because it comes every month (even if you are out of town) and is no additional cost. Using PushPay (app) comes regularly but there is a small fee when giving from your bank account and larger fee when giving via credit card. Some give via auto withdrawal from work, retirement, IRA. Farmers can give grain.

Planned gifts are a huge blessing for the parish. In January, we are planning a catered Dinner at Winfield’s to learn the advantage of working with the Catholic Foundation in your charitable giving. Scott Yates will come on Sunday, January 15 for at 5 p.m. Dinner and 5:45-6:30 presentation on how they can help people who are charitable become more educated about the variety of smart ways to give (maximizing your gift, avoiding taxes, giving flexibility etc). I have met with him and am very excited about what the Catholic Foundation is doing for people across Nebraska. Please let me or Heather know if you can attend.
