### **Pastors Corner**

Dear St Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

This past year I had a funeral for an elderly lady who was very devoted to intercessory prayer. When she said, "she would pray for you" she really meant it. Her family said she received lots of phone calls, letters and updates from numerous people about how they were doing and expressions of gratitude for the prayers.

Recently, a daughter sent me a copy a short article about Intercessory prayer that was in her prayerbook.

"We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers" 1 Thessalonians 1:2

When Paul greeted the Thessalonians, he began by telling them he had prayed for them. This greeting assured them of his concern and care. When I tell someone, "I'll pray for you," I take that commitment seriously because I know how much prayer makes a difference. Not because my prayers coerce God to act in a certain way, but because prayer offers support and encouragement by recognizing that God is involved in the situation. Many times when I've experienced the effect of someone praying for me, it empowered me to make it through whatever was happening. This experience has led me to want to pray for others. So each morning, a part of my quiet time included a list of names - those for whom I've promised to pray. I hold the list in my hands and entrust them into God's care, confident that they will be strengthened for their journey by the One who knows what they need. Sr. Joyce Rupp, O.S.M.

In talking with this family about their deceased mother's zeal for intercessory prayer, I decided to recommit myself and get better organized in my prayer list. I have long made handwritten list in my breviary of people to pray for. I then typed out a new consolidated list of people to pray for. Obviously, at the top of the list are my parishioners. Also, many whom are sick or struggling. Also, various vocations and sacramental events. Thanksgivings, special intentions, deceased, parish efforts, global concerns etc fill out the sheet. I usually take out the list, often write in a new one and lift up all these intentions to God.
