### **Assistant Pastor's Corner:**

### Dear St. Mary's and Assumption Parishioners,

Here we are back to seemingly "normal" days. The chaos and excitement surrounding Christmas and New Year's Day has subsided. We are back to what we would consider regular schedules, whether that is at work, home, school, socially, etc. It is in these days of getting back to the grind that I think we can think of these days as boring and quite ordinary. Even liturgically we have moved out of the Christmas season and are back to wearing green as we are already embarking on the third week of Ordinary Time. Does the Church also think this time of the year is mundane and boring? No. absolutely not!

We ought not understand Ordinary Time in the liturgical year to mean uneventful or dull because of the fact that we are not celebrating any of the uniqueness that the other seasons bring to our lives. If the word "ordinary" puts a bad taste in your mouth, then I propose we try to allow our perspective to be changed. What are we really celebrating during Ordinary Time? We are celebrating and diving into the public ministry of Christ. I assure you there is nothing boring, dull, or normal about that! The Baptism of the Lord is the celebration that transitions us from the Christmas season and into Ordinary Time. It is at His baptism that Christ's ministry and His salvific work begins to be visible to the world. Think about this time between His baptism until His passion, death, and resurrection. Those three years are filled with healing, miracles, profound teaching, and revealing truths about what kind of God we

Our challenge this season of Ordinary Time is to see it for what truly is. It is a time to enter into and walk with Christ in His daily life of ministry. In reality, those days are really only "ordinary" for Christ. His healings and miracles are a regular thing for him, but to everyone else they are quite remarkable! Maybe, just maybe, this season of Ordinary Time we might enter more fully into His "ordinariness". Perhaps we might accept the invitation to walk with Christ a little more closely, hear His words of truth a little more clearly, and be a little more open to receive His healing.

May God bless you in this season that is anything but ordinary, Fr. Tony Schukei
